Up on Downs is 20!

Up on Downs turns 20!

2025 will mark the twentieth anniversary since Up on Downs came into being. We asked Sande Nuttall, founder, trustee, and until very recently, director how it all started.

Up on Downs, like so many good ideas, started with a couple of mums getting together around a kitchen table, with coffee. At the time, we all had small children and the challenges began with how to make contact with other parents. At the time Facebook was barely a thing, children's centres hadn't been invented, there were no specialist DS health visitors around and getting onto the internet at home for any sort of information was a painful process involving something called "dial-up". Added to that, of course we had babies and kids who were often ill and getting out of the house to anything was a constant challenge. Wouldn't it be great, we thought, if new parents could be put in touch with each other, could meet up and share information, perhaps we could even create services to help our children develop. Maybe the professionals would listen better if we knew what to ask for and how to ask for it in their language. How did you get hold of all this "early intervention" stuff and what was it supposed to look like?



Twenty years on, we still meet up and have good ideas. Facebook, is just one of several platforms parents can find us on and we have networked to get our details onto many more. Parents can find each other in minutes on a phone now and we give families the space to come together "IRL", as they say. Our speech development programme is almost 18 years old and has had practitioners who have grown their expertise over time and a generation of children. We have successfully advocated on many fronts and created information resources of every kind. Quite a few of the tiny babies that we visited as new-borns are now off to college and many more continue to inspire us as every age.

In this, our twentieth year we are looking back to celebrate how far we have come and looking forward to taking up new challenges. As we go we'll be providing the same down to earth, friendly parent to parent support that we were set up for and the high quality services that will help your children to thrive.

The initial four modules of training will commence in March and will concentrate on language skills and DS and the research and practice in this area. You will be learning alongside Speech and Language therapists and other job roles.



Once these are completed, assuming that they have established suitability to move forwards, there would be two more modules specifically working with Leela Baksi on the Symbol Co-worker Training pack .

From September 2025 trainees would begin small group work with children who have DS. A further 1-2 sessions will be provided to give ongoing support from Leela after the direct work with children begins in September. Other ongoing support will be discussed according to need.

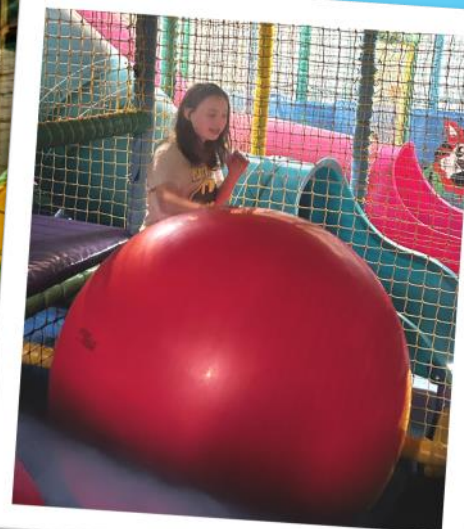


Soft Play Get Together

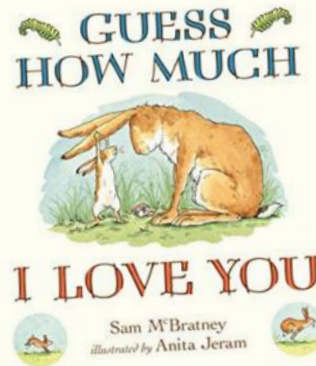

Swimmer wins eight golds at British Championships

A swimmer who trains in St Albans returned from the British Down Syndrome Swimming Championships with a haul of eight gold medals.

Joe Edwards, 15, attends St Michael's Catholic High School in Garston and recently swam in eight junior categories at the championships in Crawley on November 16 and 17.

He won gold in every single one of his events – 100m breaststroke, 50m butterfly, 200m freestyle, 50m breaststroke, 100m individual medley, 50m freestyle, 50m backstroke and 100m freestyle.

This is Joe's second time competing in the championships, following his win of three golds and one silver last year.

"But this year it was just golds," he told **STALBANS**NEWS as he joked that he is "weighed down" by all his medals.

Joe explained: "I got into swimming from my dad because he was a top swimmer, and he taught me from a very young age."

Joe has been swimming competitively since primary school and now swims with Verulam Swim Club in St Albans.

He said that he loves swimming because "you feel free in the water – it's like you have powers!".

Joe has now been invited to join the GB Down

Rob, coaching team representative at Verulam Swim Club, said: "As with any success in swimming, there are no shortcuts. Joe has had to dedicate himself to training and competing at Verulam events and open meets.

"Joe's success can be attributed to his great capacity to learn and enthusiasm to swim. Most importantly, he always has fun!"
