



Back in 2005, Mark was just 8 years old when Sande, Frances, myself and a couple of other parents decided that it was time that North Herts had some sort of Down Syndrome support group. It

was amazing to be involved from the start and to see the organisation grow over the years. We very quickly realised that the need was county-wide and before long, Up on Downs was born.

We started small with just a few family get-togethers and then, once we'd secured some initial funding from Three Valleys Water, we arranged our first outing to Woodside Animal Farm and our first Christmas Party. There were music, dance and drama workshops and of course, the speech development groups which Mark benefitted from for several years.



It's fantastic to see how the organisation has gone from strength to strength. I only wish it had been around when Mark was a baby.




When Up on Downs started, Mark was at primary school. After school and college, Mark embarked on an apprenticeship in Facilities Services. Since then, he has had jobs as a Facilities Assistant / Caretaker in schools, a scientific establishment and an engineering factory. He also worked for four years as a machine operator in a precision engineering company.

In January 2025, now age 28, Mark began a new adventure,

taking up a role as an Admin Assistant with an insurance company.

One thing that has never changed in the last 20 years is Mark's love of swimming. Mark is now a multiple medal winner and Captain of Down Syndrome Swimming Great Britain.



As Up on Downs prepares to celebrate it's twentieth anniversary, apart from feeling rather old, I am incredibly proud to have been part of this amazing organisation. It is so satisfying to see the next generation of families receiving support, building friendships and encouraging their children to lead their own unique and fulfilling lives.



#### **Starting Up on Downs**

After Lydia was born in 2000 there was not much in the way of support or finding out anything useful. The one thing that consistently helped me was talking with other parents; it was other families where I learnt about what was helpful and what the next steps may look like.

So in 2004 I contacted all the families I knew of and we started to meet in Hitchin. It soon became set on the second Saturday of the month between 2 and 4 o'clock, and has stayed the same ever since!

#### Lydia

Lydia went to mainstream school in Hitchin until she was 16, and then spent 3 years at the 6<sup>th</sup> form of Ivel Valley school, and 2 years at North Herts College. She is currently enjoying performing arts activities with Bedazzle, but we are expecting changes this year when she moves to adult care services when her EHCP comes to an end.
